CHICAGO, BURLINGTON & QUINCY RR AF1. IL, 1880's-1901, Stock. The Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad, the official name of the Burlington Route, started from humble beginnings Feb. 12, 1849 in Aurora, IL. The Aurora Branch Railroad was laid with secondhand strap iron spiked to 12 miles of wooden rails. By 1864, the railroad had 400 miles of track - all in Illinois. Burlington's rapid expansion after the Civil War was based upon sound financial management, dominated by John Murray Forbes of Boston and assisted by Charles E. Perkins. Perkins was a powerful administrator who eventually forged a system out of previously loosely-held affiliates, virtually tripling Burlington's size during his presidency from 1881 to 1901. The name also had staying power, for it lasted 106 years until the Burlington Northern merger in 1970. Great train vignette! Set of 3 \$60 or Singles \$25

SAINT JOSEPH & WESTERN RR

AF6. KS, 187-, Unissued Stock. Chartered by the Territorial legislature of Kansas in Feb. 1857. In 1860, three miles of the road were built. The name changed in 1862 to the St. Joseph & Denver City RR. The Legislature of Kansas donated 125,000 acres of land to the enterprise in 1866, and T. J. Chew was elected president. The work of construction now progressed rapidly and by May 1869, the road was built as far as Troy, KS and located as far as Hiawatha. By December it was completed to Hastings, NE, a distance of 227 miles. In 1879 the name was changed back to the Saint Joseph & Western Railroad. Printed by Tiffany & Co., Union Square, NY. \$20

AF3. IL, IA, 1902-06, Stock. American Bank Note Co., NY. Great modern reprint of the Grant Locomotive Works is also included. The Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific was organized in 1847 as the Rock Island and Lasalle. In 1852 the name was changed to the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific Railway. Great! The Pair. \$45





CLEVELAND, CINCINNATI, CHICAGO & ST LOUIS RWY

AF18. OH, 1894-1914, \$1,000 Green, \$5,000 Rust, or \$10,000 Brown 4% Gold Bond Scrips. In June 1889 the Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago & St. Louis Railway (CCC&St.L) was incorporated in Ohio. Cornelius "Commodore" Vanderbilt (1794-1877) and his descendants owned the controlling interest in this railroad company which was one of several in their railroad empire. MORRIS & ESSEX RR

AF20. NJ, 1900, \$1,000 Gold Bond. The M&E was incorporated January 29, 1835 to build a line from Newark in Essex County west to and beyond Morristown in Morris County. On July 26, 1945 the Morris & Essex was formally merged into the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad. However it remained the Morris and Essex Division, and even today New Jersey Transit calls it by that name. In 1960 the DL&W merged with the Erie Railroad to form the Erie-Lackawanna Railroad, becoming part of Conrail in 1976. Superb steam locomotive engraving by American Bank Note Co., NY. Great! NEW YORK & PUTNAM RR

AF21. NY, 1894, \$1,000 4% Gold Bond. American Bank Note Co., NY. On January 12, 1894 the New York and Putnam Railroad was organized by J. P. Morgan. Nicknamed Old Put. It was leased to the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad on February 1. On March 7, 1913 the New York & Putnam was merged into the New York & Harlem Railroad, becoming its Putnam Division. NEW YORK, NEW HAVEN & HARTFORD RR AF22. NY, CT, MA, 19--, \$10,000 Unissued Bond. The New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad was formed 24 July 1872 through the consolidation of the New York and New Haven Railroad and Hartford and New Haven Railroad. It owned a main line from New York City to Springfield, Massachusetts via New Haven and Hartford, Connecticut. American Bank Note

NEW YORK, ONTARIO & WESTERN RWY AF23. NY, 1907, \$5,000 4% Gold Bond. The New York & Oswego Midland Railroad, was the grandiose vision of Dewitt C. Littlejohn, a dynamic politician bearing an uncanny resemblance to Abraham Lincoln. His concept of a direct rail route northwest across New York State, serving virgin territory not reached by any existing line, seemed logical. Thus in 1868 the "Midland" began building, meandering this way and that to reach the towns which had put up money for its construction. Its twisting route was built "at right angles to the mountains" requiring steep grades, high bridges and enormous fills. Construction costs far exceeded estimates, and within a month of completion the Midland was bankrupt. But it survived, and was reorganized in 1880 as the New York, Ontario & Western Railway. ST. LOUIS. ALTON & SPRINGFIELD RR

AF24. IL, MO, 1887, \$1,000 5% Gold Bond. In June, 1887, the St. Louis, Alton & Springfield Railroad Company was organized, with power to build extensions from Newbern to Alton, and from Bates to Springfield, which was done. Nicknamed "the Bluff Line" in October, 1890, a receiver was appointed, followed by a reorganization under the name St. Louis, Chicago & St. Paul. Homer Lee Bank Note Co., NY. Many coupons at right. UTICA & BLACK RIVER RR

AF25. NY, 1890, \$1,000 4% Gold Bond. In 1861 the Black River & Utica reorganized and became the Utica & Black River Railroad. The U&R ran its Road from Utica north to Philadelphia by February, 1873. American Bank Note Co., NY. Exceptional! \$50

THE NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD-WHOLESALE

Perhaps no other industry in the history of America captures the adventurous spirit embodied in capitalism quite like that of the railroad. The completion of the Northern Pacific as America's second trans-continental railroad offers no better example of the triumph of the entrepreneurial spirit in the face of overwhelming odds. In 1864, President Abraham Lincoln signed into law the Northern Pacific's charter making it the beneficiary of the largest government railroad land grant in American history. This grant would eventually include over forty million acres and a vast extinguishment of Indian land titles. The original incorporators, led by the tireless advocate Josiah Perham, set out to link Lake Superior to Puget Sound. It would take nearly twenty years and countless heartaches and setbacks until the final spike completing the line was ceremoniously driven on September 8, 1883 fifty-five miles west of Helena, Montana.





"Billings was honored by a resolution that authorized placing an engraved portrait on the company's stock certificates. He accepted the compliment, declaring the

reconstruction of the Northern Pacific to be 'one of the most gratifying events of my life'."

Jay Cooke

The nation was slowly healing its wounds and recovering from the disastrous effects of the Civil War. Visionaries of the period looked to the future and the opportunities available in a recovering nation's expansion. Naturally so, men of stout hearts looked west. Thus, it is no surprise that the man who successfully orchestrated the Union effort in selling bonds to finance the war turned his eye toward his next great challenge, the resurrection of the Northern Pacific Railroad. Jay Cooke arrived on the scene, successfully lobbying Congress for legislative change which would facilitate his grand plan for financing the construction of the road. Rising costs necessitated the need for constantly growing amounts of capital and Jay Cooke boldly took the lead. Ultimately, with Jay Cooke & Company's fortunes closely tied to the Northern Pacific Project, the firm failed and was forced into bankruptcy and in some part, contributed to the onset of the financial panic of 1873.




Originally incorporated in 1863 and known as the Lake Superior and Mississippi Railroad, the road provided the first service between Duluth and the Twin Cities upon its completion in 1870. Serving as the all-important eastern terminus of the Northern Pacific Railroad, the road linked the Great Lakes and the Mississippi River. A victim of the panic of 1873, the company defaulted on its bonds and was reorganized in 1877 as the Saint Paul & Duluth Railroad. It was absorbed by the Northern Pacific in 1900. These exceptional stocks are beautifully printed by American Bank Note Company. The two Steamships and Locomotive scenes are so very impressive. A fine example of engraving of this Golden Era of Financial Printing.



The company leased to the Northern Pacific a large number of steam locomotives and a wide variety of passenger and express cars, finally selling all of its equipment to the reorganized Northern Pacific Railway Company in 1897. \$75 each








THOMAS A. EDISON-**EDISON PHONOGRAPH WORKS**

AF27. Thomas Alva Edison (1847-1931), American Inventor. In his early years, he was slow in school. In 1879, he made commercially practicable the incandescent lamp. Other inventions included the kinetoscope, ore-mill machinery, the storage battery, and dictating machine. He invented the phonograph, his greatest single achievement from the viewpoint of inventive imagination. In 1888, he founded the "Edison Phonograph Works." Stock dated 1888 signed at front with ink cancellation line, issued to Edison and beautifully signed at back in error in pencil and signed over again on top as noted above. Very Rare! SAMUEL TILDEN-INDIANA SOUTHERN RWY

AF30. Samuel (1814-1886), Tilden Statesman, Lawyer, Financier. He opposed Lincoln's election and disapproved of the Civil War. He later became Democratic candidate for president of the U.S. (1876): received about 250,000 more votes than the Republican candidate, Rutherford B. Hayes, and 184 uncontested electoral votes against 163 for

Hayes, with

returns from Oregon, Louisiana, South Carolina, and Florida (carrying 22 electoral votes altogether) missing and

not counted; an electoral commission was created by Congress (1877) to examine and report upon the contested returns in these states; the commission reported all the states in favor of Hayes, electing him president by one electoral vote. Tilden accepted the result to avoid civil war, but always maintained that he was wrongfully deprived of the election. DOES THIS ALL SOUND A BIT FAMILIAR? WILLIAM CORNELIUS VAN HORNE

ing the Chicago & Alton. The story of the building of

the Canadian Pacific Railroad is mainly a history of his achievements in over-



ANTONIO LOPEZ de SANTA ANNA-BOND

AF31. Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna, (1795?-1876), Mexican General, Revolutionist, President and Dictator. Santa Anna boldly signs this extremely graphic bond. It is without doubt the most impressive and ornate of all autographed stocks or bonds. This \$500 bond was issued in 1866 from New York City while Santa Anna was



living in exile. While he schemed to depose Emperor Maximilian, he issued these bonds in hopes of regaining power. In these attempts, he was captured and sentenced to death. Still, he was released and allowed to retire to

New York and later when blind, he died in poverty and neglect. Of course, we remember him because of his success over the Texans at the Alamo and later his defeat and capture by Sam Houston at San Jacinto in 1836. Found in an old leather container in Texas, this American bond is fully issued, uncancelled, has no folds, has full margins, and is in Superb condition. \$1,200



ANDREW CARNEGIE -UNITED STATES STEEL BOND

AF35. Andrew Carnegie (1835-1919), Manufacturer and Philanthropist. Began an illustrious career as a bobbin boy at age 13, then became a self taught telegrapher with the Pennsylvania Railroad. In 1853-65, he introduced use of the Pullman sleeping cars, organized the military telegraph department,

and was active in transporting troops during the Civil War. After leaving the railroad, he focused on iron and then the steel industry.

His policy of "putting all his eggs in one basket, and then watching the basket" was extremely successful.

By 1889 steel production in the U.S. was first in the world, and in 1901 he sold his company, Carnegie Company to the U.S. Steel Corporation for \$250 million. The Carnegie Foundation of New York donated millions to scientific research, the advancement of teaching, the furthering of international peace, and the reward of heroic acts. The foundation is well known for building public libraries. This historic bond is dated 1901, the very year that he sold his company. This beautiful \$100,000 5% United States Steel Gold Bond is issued to Andrew Carnegie, but not signed. The rarity of Carnegie stocks and bonds is well known. Recently, two signed examples of this bond were sold to collectors at \$125,000 per bond! Neatly stamp and hole cancelled. The graphics and cranberry red color are truly exceptional. JAY GOULD-SAINT JOSEPH AND WESTERN RR CO


AF36. KS, 1879, Capital Stock, issued from Elwood, Kansas to Jay Gould (1836-1892) Financier. The St. Joseph and Western was originally chartered in 1857 as the Marysville, Palmetto and Roseport RR Company with its name being changed to the St. Joseph and Denver City RR in 1862. The line extended a distance of 252 miles from St. Joseph, Kansas to Grand Island, Nebraska connecting these two important mid-western America trade centers. The company went into receivership in 1874 and sold in foreclosure in November of 1875. In 1879, (the year of this stock certificate now offered), the road came under the control of the Union Pacific Railway Company which owned a large portion of the company's stocks and bonds. It thus operated as the St. Joseph and Western Division of the Union Pacific with Jay Gould, Russell Sage, and Sidney Dillon all serving as directors of the company.

Acquisition of the Saint Joseph and Western RR was part of Gould's strategy to compete with the Union Pacific. He acquired it for his Wabash system as a weapon against the Iowa pool, a system of price agreements among the would be direct competitors of Jay Gould.

Gould forced the Union Pacific to buy him out via a stock swap. He got UP stock of great value in exchange. He made something in the neighborhood of \$7,000,000 on the deal. By 1890 he owned half of the railroad mileage in the Southwest. This stock is one of the most historic, colorful, and graphic of any signed by Jay Gould. \$1,200




AF37. J. Pierpont Morgan (1837-1913), Banker, Connoisseur of Art. J. P. Morgan & Co. became one of the most powerful banking houses in the world. Among his most daring undertakings was the formation of the US Steel Corp. in 1901. Superb 100 year bond of the New Jersey Junction Railroad dated 1886, nearly 200 coupons remain. 1870's Louisiana "Baby Bonds"

These 1870's bonds come with an interesting history. At the close of the Civil War, the federal government imposed a large tax on state bank notes. The state of Louisiana issued small bank notes and disguised them as interest-bearing bonds. These \$5.00 "Baby Bonds" have a picture of a baby on the front. Thus the state avoided the tax. Everyone knew that they were worth the same as federally approved currency, so they were used throughout the state.

In the 1880's Louisiana's State Treasurer, Ed Bunker, had used the original plates to reprint

these bonds with identical numbers. About \$300,000 in counterfeit Baby Bonds were discovered in his safe deposit box. He fled to Brazil. These genuine \$5.00 Baby Bonds each have their own serial number and Ed Bunker's facsimile signature.
